The exhibit features the Haudenosaunee symbolism of "The Tree of Peace," also known as the white pine or *Pinus strobus*, one of the oldest trees in North America. The white pine is the only five-needled tree in New York State, and has been used by generations of Haudenosaunee storytellers to depict the "bundling" of five nations together under one law.

HOW TO REGISTER

ONLINE REGISTRATION

In January 2014, Cornell Plantations launched a new online portal for viewing and registering for upcoming public programs, classes and workshops, to replace the system we have used for the past several years. This new program, powered and hosted by NEACT, offers many new features and will greatly improve the efficiency of our online registration system. You can:

- Scan our calendar to see what events are coming up;
- Browse our catalog of programs by category;
- Register and pay for classes online using the secure portal;
- Read biographies of our class instructors;
- Update your contact information, household members, membership status, and more at any time.

To register for a program online, follow these simple steps:

- 1. Navigate to our Adult & Community Education portal at www.cornellplantations.org/event.
- 2. Peruse our program offerings by calendar view or by category view.
- 3. You must register as a new user, or sign-in to sign up for a program. Because this is a new software system and database, you will need to register as a new user on your first visit, even if you have used our previous system for purchasing classes in the past. However, once you have completed this simple **one-time** registration process, you will be in the system --- and signing up for classes will be a breeze!
- 4. Once you have registered on the site, select the programs or classes you are interested in, and they will be added to your shopping cart. (You can also make a "quick purchase" by entering the class code for the program you want.)
- **5.** When you are ready, proceed to check-out and follow the instructions.
- **6.** Remember to keep track of your user name and password for future visits.
