

PLC TEAM LEADER TRAINING

This class is self-paced and non-facilitator led consisting of 3 units. Each unit will consist of approximately 4-6 instructional hours.

Tutorial Description

Whether you choose to work across regions, within districts, schools, or individual departments; Professional Learning Communities can be customized to match your members needs to create a shared vision, work and learn collaboratively, visit and review other classrooms, and participate in decision making. Blackboard is a Learning Management System that is Web-based and designed to allow students and faculty to participate in classes delivered online or use online materials and activities to complement face-to-face teaching. This workshop will teach team leaders their role in the PLC and how to get it up and ready to go for collaboration.

Tutorial Materials

All material will be incorporated into the online tutorial. You will find content that must be completed in each unit. These reviews will help you better understand the content and better prepare you for the activities.
